1. All candidates, political workers, and literature about candidates were at least 10 ft. from area designated by county board of elections as the polling place.		
2. The polling place was an area in a single room in full view of the election officials (judge of elections, majority inspector, minority inspector machine inspectors).		
3. The voting devices and booths were facing the election officials.		
4. A sample ballot, a list of people who cast absentee ballots, cards of instructions and penalties, notice of new voter ID requirements, provisional ballot requirements and complaint procedures were posted in clear view.		
5. No one except authorized election officials, inspectors, overseers, watchers, and voters were in the polling place.		
6. If you cannot read or you have a disability, you were able to get help voting.		
7. If police officers were present, it was only for voting or preserving the peace at the request of the election official.		
8. No gifts, threats, or promises were made which might affect a person's vote.		
9. A demonstration model of the voting machine or electronic voting system, if used, was available for instruction.		
10. If paper ballots or electronic voting devices were used, the election officials checked the ballot number to see that the stubs were removed before the ballots were cast.		
11. You were offered the opportunity to cast a provisional ballot if... <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You went to vote at the right polling place for your home address but your name was not on the list of registered voters, or • You were voting at that polling place for the first time but did not have the required ID. • You were denied the right to vote for any other reason. 		
12. If you had a complaint regarding the new voter ID or provisional ballot requirements, and you were unable to get it resolved with the Judge of Elections, you were offered a complaint form to submit to the PA Department of State.		
13. There were disabled parking spaces, the path to the poll was accessible and there were accessible voting systems.
